Fine large photogravure from Canada depicting Oscar Wainwright who had the best bowling average in 1895 for the Lawrence Club. 37cm x 50cm £250



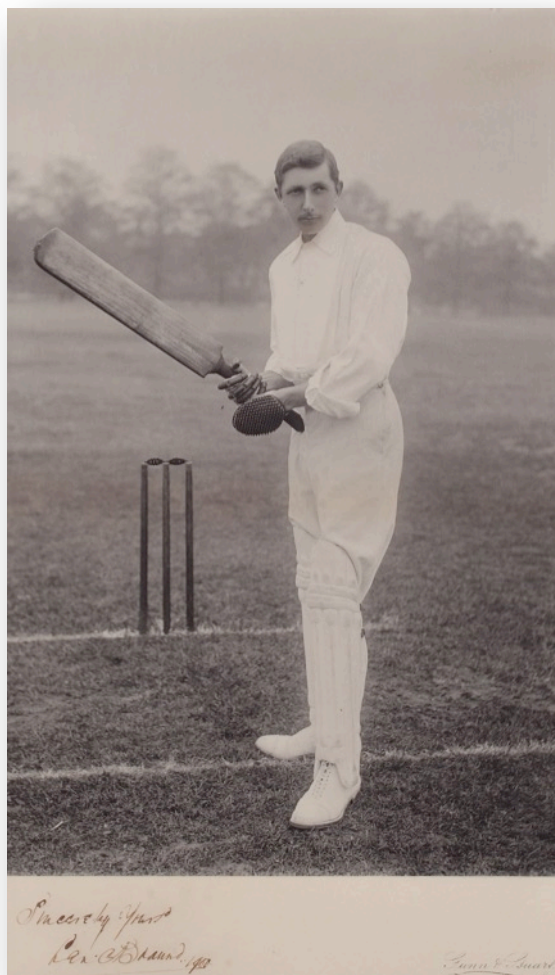
240. EDWARD POOLEY, GF GRACE & JAMES SOUTHERTON

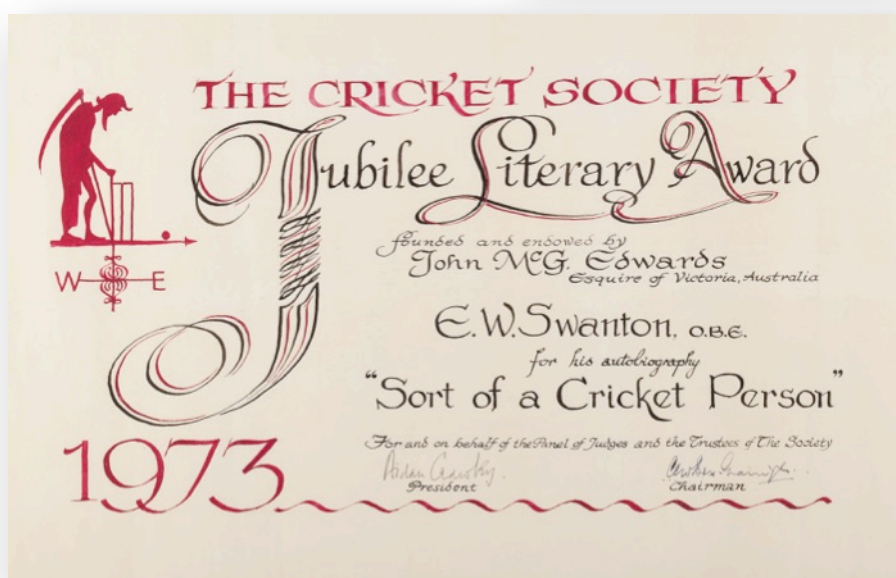
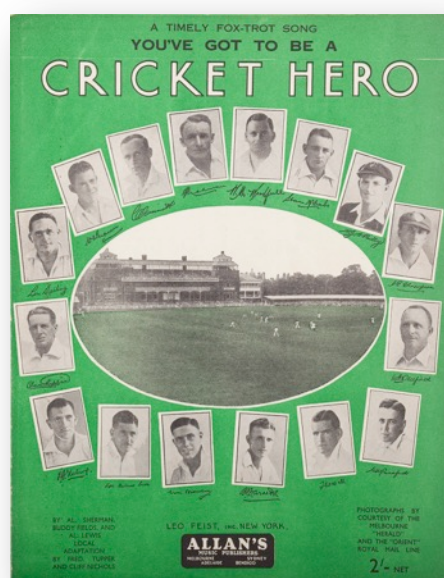
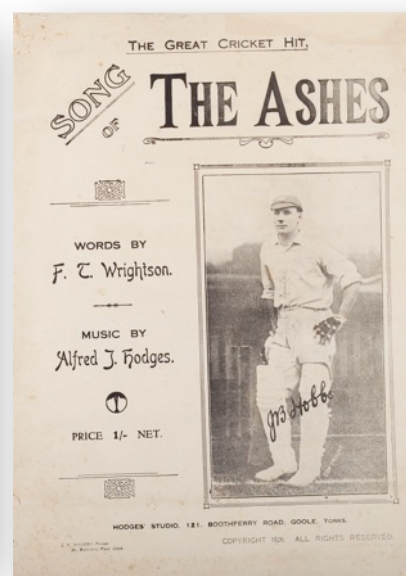
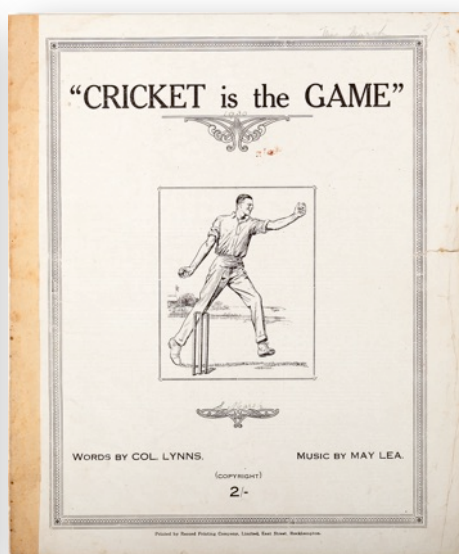
Fine team photo by Sidney Riley of Brisbane, signed by the players. This was the property of Colin Cowdrey. £550

256. M F NORTH'S TOUR TO HOLLAND, JUNE 1931

Superb scrapbook detailing this little-known tour, prepared by the captain and manager RM "Dick" Bell. Contains photographs, autographs, brochures, cuttings and a multitude of ephemera – all laid out in neat style. The side included CS Dempster, DPB Morkel, Brinckman and Bell. Much valuable information on Dutch cricket of the period. £750





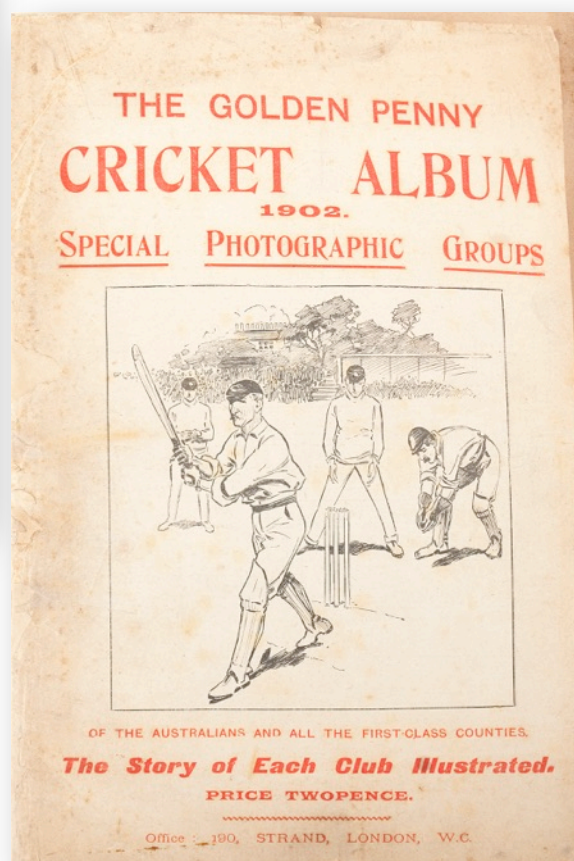
257. VADE MECUM OF ART by NICHOLAS FELIX

Felix's original manuscript, 33cm x 27cm, of an unpublished book. Although apparently unfinished, this work runs to some 10,000 words (all in Felix's neat hand-writing) and around 40 illustrations. It comprises a comprehensive instructional treatise on the art of drawing and painting. Although it carries the date 1858, this may have been the projected publication date and its unfinished state can probably be attributed to the stroke that Felix suffered in 1857. Preserved in a magnificent folding display box. A true museum item. £5000



258. THE FOOTBALL AND CRICKET STAR

Issue for 20 May 1911. App large folio newspaper in remarkable state of preservation. Presumably issued in conjunction with The Morning Leader, we have been able to find no record of this publication. Inside headline – "Dr EM Grace Dead". £500



259. GOLDEN PENNY CRICKET ALBUM (right)

This interesting booklet was issued for two years only – 1902 and 1903. We have fine copies for both years in original wrappers. Illustrations throughout by RP Hill ("Rip!") £550 the set

260. CRICKET BELT AND BUCKLE

We have had cricket belts from the 1860s and 1870s in fine states of repair but never before one with a silver buckle. The belt is satin-backed velvet with ornate embroidery. The silver buckle is hallmarked for Birmingham 1876 and carries a monogram which could be FCD – possibly FC Dillon who played for IZ and MCC around this time but we may never know.

261. VICTORIAN PENCIL CASE

Child's pencil case, c1890, with humorous painted cricket scene. Scarce.

262. METAL DESK ACCESSORY

Delightful metal container, c1910, with painted cricket scene and decoration to rim and base. Ideal for the cricketer's desk.

Bakelite box with painted lid depicting the famous Hayman painting of Cricket in the Artillery Ground. Early 20th century

265. DARNALL CRICKET GROUND. SHEFFIELD

A pair of scarce admission coins for a Grand Cricket Match at Darnall. Most likely the match between Sussex and All England in 1827. Two coins are nicely framed as a pair, thereby showing both sides.

266. MCC JUBILEE SILK HEADSCARF

Rare silk square with the image "Grand Jubilee Match... July 10th 1837." To commemorate the 50th year of MCC. 90cm x 86cm. The central illustration is faded but a remarkable survivor.

271. SILVER PLATED CRUET SET

Superb silver-plate and cut glass cruet set by Philip Ashberry of Sheffield, c1900 (height 15cm). All complete and in very good condition - salt, pepper and mustard with crossed cricket bats and ball. £550

English pewter lidded tea caddy by Alexander Clark Co, c1920s. 17cm high £150



273. DICK HOWARTH'S MCC TOURING BLAZER

Blazer for the MCC Tour to West Indies in 1947/48. This was the property of Dick Howarth the Worcestershire and England all-rounder who played 5 times for his country. £450

274. BRONZE – THE BATSMAN (above right)

Bronze statue, signed E Picoult, c1920. Height 45cm. Impressive study of a batsman with rich bronze patina. A fine piece. £1750

275. GARNITURE BASED ON C B FRY (below)

A three piece garniture made from spelter and comprising a batsman, bowler and wicket-keeper atop a clock. Believed to be modeled on CB Fry. £750

276. CRICKET AT WINDSOR CASTLE MEAT DISH

Large meat dish produced by Goodwin & Harris in their Metropolitan Scenery series, c1835 (48cm x 39cm). A very rare and attractive item, craftsman restored to the highest standard. This is a large dish and would be the centrepiece of any cricket ceramics collection £2250
